DALLAS, Texas, February 18, 2020 – The Executive Board of Tri Delta announced today that it has temporarily suspended the operations of the Epsilon Zeta Chapter at Loyola Marymount University, effective May 1, 2020, for a minimum of four years.

"It is with heavy hearts that we have suspended the operations of our Epsilon Zeta Chapter at Loyola Marymount," said Kimberlee Di Fede Sullivan, Tri Delta's Fraternity President. "The decision was made following several years of declining membership numbers, despite our members' hard work and the dedication of the volunteers and staff who supported this wonderful chapter."

"Our priority now is assisting our members through this transition. These are cherished sisters who will continue their lifelong membership in Tri Delta as unaffiliated collegiate members," said Sullivan. "Tri Delta has enjoyed 15 years as a part of the Loyola Marymount community. We will work with our loyal alumnae and university staff to ensure a successful return to campus so that future generations of Tri Deltas have the opportunity to experience our sisterhood, dedicated to helping women live, learn and lead – with Purpose – for a lifetime."
